



WINTER WEEKENDS Annotated Schedule

Friday evening

Snack: A light snack will be available each night, in the dining hall or around a campfire.

Devotions: This is a time for a few verses of Scripture, sharing, singing and group prayer.

After devotions: Everyone should be quiet and have the lights out. One adult is asked to stay in the cabin at all times.

Saturday

Coffee & fellowship is available in the dining hall before staff meeting.

Staff meeting: The day begins with staff Bible study in the craft building. Bring a Bible. Announcements will be made. Cabin leaders are expected to attend. Adult helpers are encouraged to attend. Division directors will arrange to have some adults stay in the division for camper supervision.

Campers wake up: Hopefully, the campers will sleep until the bell rings. Remind them not to get up before the bell, but when it does ring they must start getting ready for the day.

Catch-ups: The campers line up, with the cabin leader at the back of the line, in the front of the dining hall. Mealtime catch-ups are held outside the dining hall. Catch-ups are used in emergencies to account for everyone, and at any time when it is necessary to talk to or account for the group.

Morning Watch: This is the camper's own quiet time. Each camper will receive a printed lesson to use. Campers and staff should scatter to individual spots for their own quiet time. Younger campers may need help especially the first day, or the cabin leader may need to show the whole cabin how to do it the first day.

Meals: Campers and staff catch up outside the dining hall and then file in. Proceed to the assigned table and remain standing. Then we sing and say grace together. Everyone is to remain in the dining hall until dismissed. Remind campers to use the bathroom before meals.

Hopper: The designated camper in each cabin who brings additional food to the cabin's table for one meal.

Scraper: The designated camper in each cabin who clears the table for one meal.

Activities: Campers will attend the assigned activities. Adult helpers and cabin leaders stay with their campers and assist as able, unless assigned another responsibility.

Bible Exploration: Cabin leaders lead their cabin in Bible study, using the prepared materials. Each cabin group will find a place outside, in a relatively quiet spot.

Rest Hour: During rest hour each camper should be on their own bunk quiet enough to allow others to sleep if they want. The DD will establish the particular standards.

Free Time/Tuck Shop: Optional activities will be announced at lunch. The camp store will be open to sell snacks and T-shirts.

Evening Program: It will include an activity followed by a campfire, with a songfest and short message or story.

Cabin Devotions: Cabin leaders may use the suggestion provided under that day's Bible Ex as a follow-up to the lesson. And/or it can include a short discussion to follow up the evening's all-camp theme (the game and message).

Sunday

Worship Service: Our own worship service will, hopefully, be held out of doors.

Cleanup: Everyone will pack their belongings, move everything on top of their bunk and clean up the cabin. Assign each camper a share in the responsibility for the cabin, the grounds and the bathroom. Each cabin is inspected before that cabin goes to lunch.

Good-bye circle: Everyone will gather to sing and pray before we leave.

Tuck Shop: A final chance to get a T-shirt or candy and soda "for the road."
